### Trinity River

Steelhead fishing on the Trinity River is pretty typical for this time of year. Lots of dark or spent fish – with a nice fresh one every now and then. But—just when that seems to be the norm – in walk some guys--stating they just got into a mess of fresh fish down below Junction City. So there you go--

Also, this time of year, Brown Trout encounters really go on the upswing. This year is no different. From Lewiston all the way down to Big Bar the guys are hooking fish to 8lbs.

Weather you're after Steelhead or Browns—Flies like—Golden Stones, Red Copper Johns, and Hare's Ears, under an indicator are getting the job done. Garden Hackle (night crawlers), silver/ blue or brass/ red Spoons and an array of plugs are also accounting for some dandy hook-ups—

### Trinity Lake

Bass fishing on the big lake is starting to come on. Last week was pretty good for a few guys, with lots of sunshine during the days and night time temps staying in the 40"s the water was trying to warm up.

As soon as the a.m. water temps are in the high 40"s to low 50"s the fishing should ready bust lose? Crawdad colored Crank Baits, Gitzits, Rip Baits and Senko type soft plastic Baits are top producers fro both Large & Smallmouths.

If you're thinking trout—the mouths of the major tributaries are your best bet. Trolling, Spoons or Rapala type plugs, or just bank fishing with an egg & marshmallow combo, Powerbait, or crawlers will usually get the job done.
